Capital, Coast and Hutt Valley offer a 12 month NETP/NESP Programme with a permanent contract in one clinical area (NETP) or two clinical areas (NESP) at a minimum of 0.8FTE as negotiated with the employer. A postgraduate certificate is integrated into the NESP programme and is delivered by Whitireia Polytechnic. The NETP Programme contains an in-house curriculum focussed on assessment skills, transition skills and area specific education. Graduates in the NETP and NESP Programmes are supported throughout by the NETP and NESP teams and allocated preceptors.

- Cultural support for Maori and Pacific nurses throughout the Programme
- Career conversations to support career goals and applications for postgraduate study and professional development.
