Graduate Registered Nurses are employed on the NETP Programme on a fixed term contract for 12 months. During the recruitment process, applicants will be asked to indicate in which area they would like to work. Clinical placements are planned to take into consideration your preferences and service requirements. In the Advanced Choice of Employment (ACE) application process, there is an opportunity to identify areas of clinical preference.

Each Registered Nurse RN graduate has an assigned preceptor(s) who has completed an approved training programme. After induction week, the RN graduate and Preceptor initially share a clinical workload before carrying their own clinical load. Preceptors and other members of the clinical team, work alongside graduates to support goal setting and opportunities for reflective practice.

The NETP Programme offers a formal, structured and supported learning programme. There are 12 designated education days over the programme period.
