The Nurse Entry to Practice Programme (NETP) and Nurse Entry to Specialist Practice (NESP) accommodates NETP/NESP graduates both within the hospital and primary care settings. Central to Capital and Coast District Health Board (CCDHB) philosophy for continuing nursing education is the commitment to providing a supported learning environment. The NETP/NESP programme offered at CCDHB has recently been accredited by the Nursing Council of New Zealand.

We provide new graduate nurses the opportunity to join our organisation in making a difference to the health and wellbeing of the patients we serve.

Māori and Pacific population needs are a priority for this DHB and this is reflected in opportunities for nurses who identify as Māori or Pacific.
