We offer permanent positions with ongoing employment. You will attend 19 paid study days based in Christchurch (travel and accommodation paid for by WCDHB)

You will also complete a postgraduate certificate (level 800) with the University of Otago

You will also receive clinical and group supervision to help develop your practice
