About Te Whatu Ora - Hauora a Toi Bay of Plenty

There is a structured orientation to Te Whatu Ora - Hauora a Toi Bay of Plenty, the NETP/ NESP programme and the RN graduate's clinical placement.

Every RN graduate is assigned a preceptor(s) who has completed an approved training programme. Preceptors, and other members of the clinical team, work alongside the RN graduate providing support and opportunities for critical analysis, reflection and goal setting.

RN graduates are required to submit an e-Portfolio at RN Competent Level prior to completion of the programme. Resources, including access to Te Whatu Ora - Hauora a Toi Bay of Plenty 's e-Learning site are provided to enable the graduate to complete this.

Ongoing employment within the Te Whatu Ora - Hauora a Toi Bay of Plenty is subject to graduates meeting the NETP/NESP requirements and vacancy availability at the time of completing the programme.

GRADUATE NURSING

Tauranga and Whakatāne Hospital

Nurse Entry to Specialty Programme (NESP) - Mental Health & Addiction Services

Registered Nurse (RN) graduates are employed onto the NETP/NESP Programme for a 12 month fixed term contract. In the majority of cases graduates will undertake one 12 month placement during this period.

Some Registered Nurse (RN) graduates employed onto the NESP / NETP Programme may have 2 clinical placements during the 12 month period.

All graduates will complete a PG paper (NESP 2 PG papers) and have access to the resources and developmental opportunities within the Te Whatu Ora - Hauora a Toi Bay of Plenty graduate program.
