ABOUT CCDHB

The Nurse Entry to Practice Programme (NETP) accommodates NETP graduates within the hospital, aged residential care and primary care settings. Central to Capital and Coast District Health Board (CCDHB) philosophy for continuing nursing education is the commitment to providing a supported learning environment.

We provide new graduate nurses the opportunity to join our organisation in making a difference to the health and wellbeing of the patients we serve.

Māori and Pacific population needs are a priority for this DHB and this is reflected in opportunities for nurses who identify as Māori or Pacific.

CCDHB has two NETP Programme intakes for graduate nurses per year in August and January.

These fixed term contracts are within practice areas that have protected positions for graduates and are 32 or 36 hours per week (depending on area)

As a teaching hospital, continuing nursing education is supported through the senior nursing team in your area, clinical load sharing and support from the NETP Coordinators and Victoria University Wellington Nurse Lecturer.

NETP

- 12 month Fixed-term contract in one clinical area
- 0.8 FTE contract (except NICU 0.9FTE)
- Level 8 paper embedded within the Programme, delivered in partnership with Victoria University of Wellington
- Portfolio support and monthly meetings with NETP Coordinators
- Additional study days for Maori and Pacific graduates including cultural mentorship and academic support

NESP

- Two level 8 papers delivered by Whitireia NZ
- Mixture of inpatient and community rotations including: acute inpatient, forensic, youth, intellectual disabilities, community mental health, Maori and pacific health teams
- 0.9 contract- work 0.8- one paid study and supervision day fortnightly
- 20 hours clinical supervision for the duration of the academic programme
- Two year contract
- Individual learning plan for in-service training
- Mental Health, Addictions and Intellectual Disability nursing- inpatient and community- up to 50 positions over two intakes
