WHO WE ARE

Hutt Valley offers a 12 month NETP/NESP programme with a permanent contract in one clinical area (NETP) or two clinical areas (NESP) at a minimum of 0.8 FTE as negotiated with the employer.

A postgraduate certificate is integrated into the NESP programme and is delivered by Whitireia Polytechnic. The NETP Programme contains an in-house curriculum focussed on assessment skills, transition skills and area specific education.

In the past graduates have been employed in Mental Health, Addictions, and Intellectual Disability Services (MHAIDS), Medical, General Surgery & Gynaecology, Burns & Plastics, Orthopaedics, Paediatrics, Special Care Baby Unit, Theatres, PACU/SAU/DSU, Older Persons & Rehabilitation services, Emergency Department, Medical Assessment & Planning Unit, District Nursing, Primary and ARC.

On completion of the NETP/NESP year, nursing graduates will meet competencies and standards of practice at "competent" level on the Hutt Valley Professional Development and Recognition Programme (PDRP) which is consistent with the Nursing Council of New Zealand requirements for registered nurses.
