WHO WE ARE

Hutt Valley DHB offers a 12 month programme with a fixed term contract in one clinical area at a minimum of 0.8 FTE as negotiated with the employer.

A postgraduate paper is integrated into the programme and is delivered by The Graduate School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health at Victoria University.

In the past graduates have been employed in Medical, General Surgery & Gynaecology, Burns & Plastics, Orthopaedics, Paediatrics, Special Care Baby Unit, Theatres, Older Persons & Rehabilitation services, Emergency Department, Medical Assessment & Planning Unit and District Nursing.

On completion of the NETP year, nursing graduates will meet competencies and standards of practice at "competent" level on the Hutt Valley DHB Professional Development and Recognition Programme (PDRP) which is consistent with the Nursing Council of New Zealand requirements for registered nurses.
