ABOUT TDH

Graduate Registered Nurses are employed on the NETP Programme on a fixed term contract for 10 months. During the recruitment process, applicants will be asked to indicate in which area they would like to work. Clinical placements are planned to take into consideration your preferences and service requirements. In the Advanced Choice of Employment (ACE) application process, there is an opportunity to identify three areas of clinical preference.

Each Registered Nurse RN graduate has an assigned preceptor(s) who has completed an approved training programme. After induction week, the RN graduate and Preceptor initially share a clinical workload before carrying their own clinical load. Preceptors and other members of the clinical team, work alongside graduates to support goal setting and opportunities for reflective practice.

The NETP Programme offers a formal, structured and supported learning programme. There are 12 designated education days (4 of this is induction week) over the programme period and an additional time for professional development.

Embedded within the NETP Programme is a postgraduate course provided through Eastern Institute of Technology, this is a 30 credit PostGrad speciality paper based upon your clinical area of practice.

GRADUATE NURSING

The Hauora Tairāwhiti NETP programme aims to provide a supportive learning environment where theoretical knowledge and clinical skills can be learned and applied.

Embedded within our NETP Programme is a postgraduate course offered by Eastern Institute of Technology (EIT) and Hauora Tairāwhiti. This formalises the learning that occurs throughout the programme.

The NETP programme provides newly registered nurses with the opportunity to advance their professional practice, knowledge and skills within their area of practice.

We are committed to growing our own future workforce locally, therefore consideration is given to both local people and Māori in the screening and interview process.

Upon successful completion of the NETP programme, registered nurses will be recognised as competent practitioners on the Professional Development Recognition Programme (PDRP).
