ABOUT US

Te Whatu Ora Wairarapa (TWOW) currently recruits nursing graduates who have completed and passed their NZ State Final exams from around NZ. Graduate intake numbers are dependent on vacancies within clinical areas within the hospital and community. We employ graduates on a permanent contract at 0.8FTE (NETP) and 0.9FTE (NESP).

Graduates will be informed of their clinical placement and/or rotations before starting the programme. Once accepted, the terms of agreement for such placements are fixed for the NETP year. NESP graduates complete two rotations.

Within clinical areas graduates will be expected to complete generic online learning packages, orientation workbooks and study days additional to and as well as NETP/NESP study days and course work (postgrad).

Initially this appears to be an overwhelming amount of work. It is strongly recommended that graduates use the knowledge and skills of their appointed Preceptor, Clinical Coach, Nurse Educator and Nurse Managers within their clinical area. The NETP/NESP Coordinator is also available for clinical support and will visit frequently. The lecturers (Vic Uni NETP/Whitireia NESP) support graduates' academic needs within the programme.

GRADUATE NURSING

The aim of the NETP/NESP programme is to provide graduate Registered Nurses support and professional development to facilitate their transition during their first year of practice.

On completion of the NETP/NESP year, nursing graduates will meet competencies and standards of practice at "competent" level on the Professional Development and Recognition programme (PDRP) which is consistent with the Nursing Council of New Zealand requirements for registered nurses.

For NETP, TWOW offers one Level 8 postgraduate paper through Victoria University of Wellington. The NESP programme requires completion of two Level 8 PG papers through Whitireia, resulting in a PG Certificate in Specialty Practice. These assist graduates to demonstrate competent nursing practice on completion of the programme. The primary focus of this paper is physical health assessment and making clinical judgments at a graduate nurse level.

TWOW understands the demands and stresses faced by new graduates when they commence their first year of practice and are committed to supporting them through their first year with the assistance of our NETP/NESP Coordinator, Clinical Coach, Preceptors, Nurse Educators, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Nurse Managers and nursing staff to complete this programme (which includes collaborating with the Tertiary Educator Provider to deliver education at Level 8 on the NZQA scale).

The NESP programme also provides graduates with 20 clinical supervision sessions throughout the duration of their NESP year.
