Our Nursing Council of New Zealand (NCNZ) approved programme is designed to ensure that through support, guidance and preceptoring you are confident applying the theory you have learnt, to your everyday nursing practice.

The programme is for a 12 month period.

Clinical placements will be in two 6 month rotations or, one 12 month placement and reflect both the NETP graduates and our service needs. This programme provides a supported pathway, both clinical and educational. In partnership with a tertiary provider it is our aim is to ensure the provision of your first post graduate paper.

Study days will be held throughout your graduate year and a comprehensive clinical orientation will be provided for each rotation.
